

What is Project SEARCH?

Project SEARCH is a one-year, school-to-work program designed to prepare young adults with disabilities for competitive employment. Participants gain transferable, marketable job skills and valuable hands-on experience in a real-world work setting.

What You'll Learn:

- Essential job skills like communication, teamwork, and problem-solving
- Soft skills like professionalism, time management, and work ethic
- Specific job-related tasks relevant to different departments within Banner Health McKee

How it Works:

- Participants complete 3 rotations throughout various departments within Banner Health McKee
- Job mentors and trainers provide individualized support and guidance.
- The program incorporates classroom instruction and career exploration activities.
- Graduates receive assistance with job placement upon completion.

Benefits:

- Develop skills and confidence for successful employment
- Increase independence and self-esteem
- Build a strong work ethic and professional network
- Explore career paths and identify interests
- Secure competitive employment after graduation



Who is Eligible?

Students ages 18-21 who are currently receiving services through TSD Integrated Services and demonstrate transition needs in their Individualized Education Plan (IEP) are eligible.

Students must be interested in obtaining a paid job and have completed credits required for graduation prior to entering the program. Students must be in their last year of receiving support from TSD and have applied and be eligible for Division of Vocational Rehabilitation.
