



Indications for Dermatologic Cancer Risk Assessment

If one or more of the statements apply to your patient, consider a referral to an oncology genetic counselor.

Melanoma

- Three or more cases of melanoma and/or pancreatic cancer in close relatives
- Three or more primary melanomas, in the same individual
- Melanoma and pancreatic cancer in the same person
- Melanoma and a significant personal or family history of breast, ovarian, prostate or pancreatic cancer
- Melanoma and astrocytoma in the same person

Sebaceous Adenoma

- Sebaceous adenoma/carcinoma and one additional case of any Lynch Syndrome associated cancer in the same person or in relatives
- Sebaceous adenoma with IHC analysis showing loss of function of the MLH1, MSH2, MSH6 and/or PMS2 proteins

Basal Cell Carcinoma

- More than five basal cell carcinomas or basal cell carcinoma diagnosed under age 30

Miscellaneous Skin Findings

- Oral or ocular neuromas
- Cutaneous leiomyoma
- Multiple trichilemmomas, acral keratoses, oral papillomas, mucocutaneous neuromas, macular pigmentation of glans penis
- Mucocutaneous pigmentation and more than one Peutz-Jegher polyp in same person
- Five or more fibrofolliculomas, perifollicular fibromas, trichodiscomas/angiofibromas and acrochordons

Other

- Early-onset breast cancer (<45), colon, uterine, diffuse gastric or renal cancer (under <50)
- Ovarian/fallopian tube cancer, male breast cancer, medullary thyroid cancer, metastatic prostate cancer, pancreatic cancer, or adrenocortical carcinoma at any age
